

NPQ State Conference 2023 Timetable

Day 1 Thursday 14th September

11.40am - Bus will meet Jetstar JQ930 and Virgin VA771 and take passengers to Conference Centre. Note we are not providing lunch on this day.

2.00pm – Bus departs for Cattana Wetlands Walk in north Cairns. This 80 hectare nature conservation park, home to a wealth of bird and plant life, includes toilets and a boardwalk through fern palm forest. Led by Geoff McClure one of the volunteers at the park.

4.30 pm - Return Depart time 4.30pm.

6pm - Dinner. After dinner interpretive talk by Bob Jago and Stuart Worboys. "What to expect in the area."

Day 2 Friday 15th September

Breakfast is provided to all staying at the Conference Centre on each day.

8.30 am Departure

Stop 1 10.00 - 12am Josephine Falls is a tiered cascade waterfall on the Josephine Creek under Mt Bartle Frere, Qld's highest mountain. Unfortunately, we will not have the time to climb the mountain. Toilets

Day 5 Monday 18th September - Mossman

8.30am Departure

Stop 1 9.30am Mossman Gorge. Our bus stops at the Interpretative Centre We will first have tea and coffee; then move into the Centre and take the shuttle bus to the Gorge. Bob Jago and Stuart Worboys will guide you through the Gorge. The plants are generally not named, the range is enormous, and you will need their help. There is a Suspension bridge on the route which has to be crossed twice. After we have finished the walk, we can get the lunch from the bus and eat it outside or in the Centre. Toilets

After Mossman Gorge we may visit Scommazons Farm Stores which has a wide range of tropical fruits, a group of large Barringtonias at Four Mile Beach or the south end of Wangetti Beach which has a raw patch of stunning and untouched coastline which has been naturally eroded leaving a quirky pebble stone covered section.
